TN River Healthy Watershed Grant Overview

The TNRR5K planning committee aims to raise awareness about protecting water resources in our region, and encourage the community to take action through on-the-ground projects. A portion of the proceeds generated from the TNRR5K will be given back to the community through a grant award. The award amount is fluid, as it is based on the proceeds from the event (no more than \$2,500). Local non-profit organizations (NPOs) will have the opportunity to submit stewardship proposals that will be judged by the TNRR5K Planning Committee. The committee is seeking projects focused on **Pollutant Runoff Reduction Implementation**. Contest entries include any proposed project that involves the implementation/installation stormwater control measures (SCMs) that will improve stormwater runoff quality and/or reduce stormwater runoff quantity within a specific watershed. Examples of SCMs include, but are not limited to, rain gardens or other bio-retention basins, tree plantings, downspout disconnection, rain barrels, etc.

Application Guidelines:

Eligibility: The TNRR5K Prize can be awarded to any NPO that submits an application with a signed

Implementation Certification Statement that attest the award money will be utilized to implement the

project as submitted in the contest entry form. There is no match requirement.

TNRR5K Planning Committee: The TNRR5K Planning Committee will be comprised of a single member from the following organizations:

- Knox County Stormwater
- City of Knoxville Solid Waste
- University of Tennessee Stormwater
- Tennessee Smart Yards

Each TN River Healthy Watershed Award entry will be evaluated/scored based on the following components:

- Overall Structure/Organization/Quality of the Proposal
- Potential Improvements to Watershed Quality
- Timeframe of Project Implementation
